ALTERNATE DAY SPRINKLING/WATERING IN EFFECT

Due to the high demand for water in order to insure that all users have adequate water for irrigation, alternate day sprinkling and watering is in effect for both domestic well water and the Irrigation Ditch.

NORTH of the Elementary School = **EVEN** days
SOUTH of Elementary School(including the School) = **ODD** days

Hand Watering - allowed at all times.

All set sprinklers are subject to the Alternate Day Schedule.
The Riggins City Council asks for your cooperation to help make water available for the duration of the summer.

NORTH=EVEN

SOUTH=ODD

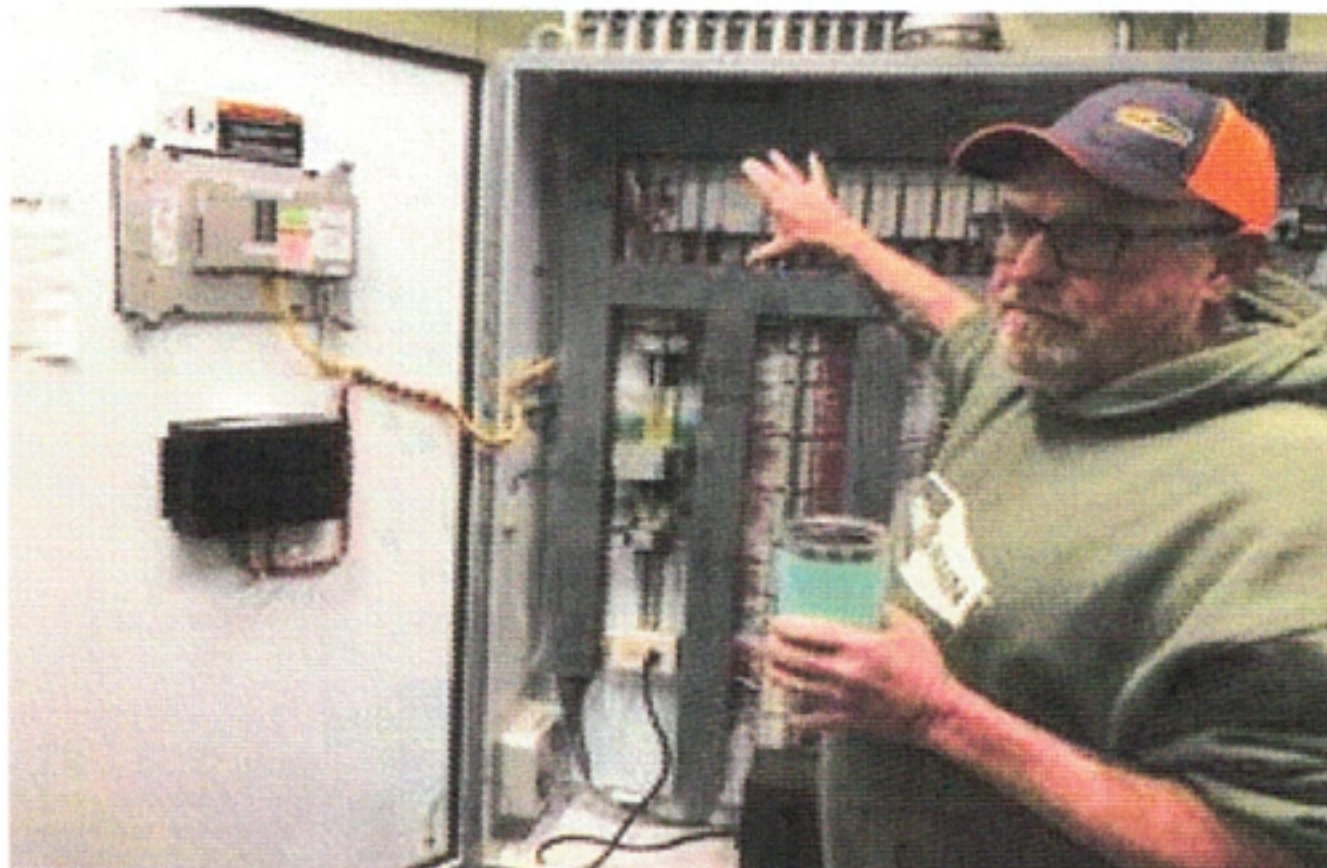
PUBLIC WORKS CORNER
