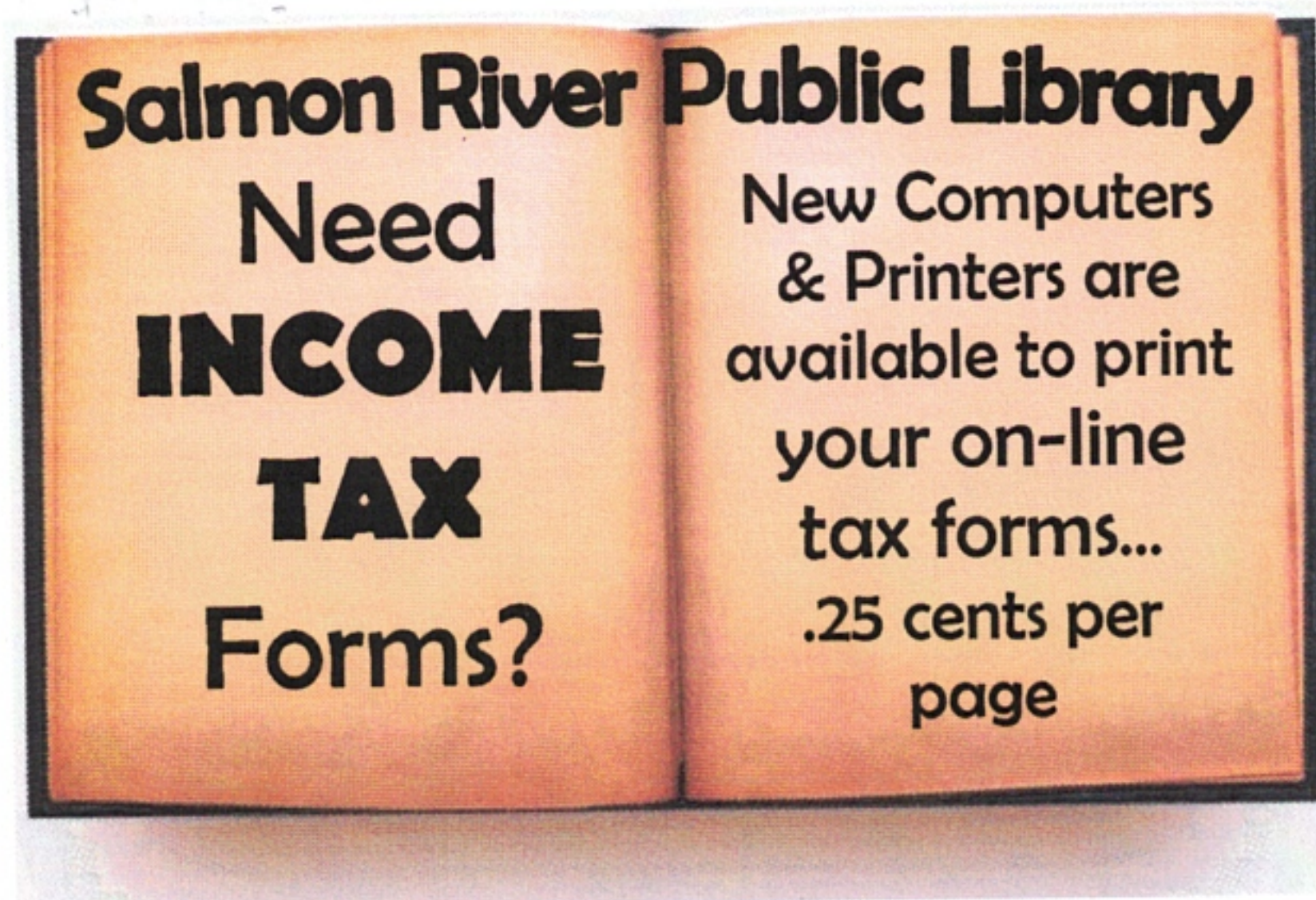


### PUBLIC WORKS CORNER

# RIGGINS AMBULANCE

March was a busy month for our ambulance crew. We started the month with a 2-day EMS Conference in Grangeville. We received great training on multiple subjects including Head Trauma, Time-Sensitive Emergencies, Vehicle Extrication, and Pediatric Care. The Grangeville EMT Association hosts this yearly conference at Grangeville High School. Multiple Agencies from around Idaho travel to attend. Having this local conference is very beneficial to our crew. Did you know that EMTs are required to have 40 hours of organized continued education every 2 years to renew their license?

March 19th we co-hosted our 1st Annual First Responders Bash. Talk about AMAZING! The support in this community is unheard of. THANK YOU! The proceeds were split 3 ways to the City Fire Department, Salmon River Rural Fire and to the Riggins Ambulance.

The Ambulance is going to use these funds to purchase new extrication equipment. Our new system will have more cutting power and sharper blades. This equipment upgrade would not have happened without the community support. We are hosting a multi-agency extrication training weekend in May. We are excited for the training with our new extrication equipment.

Call numbers continue to rise. Your crew is working hard to care for the community and we love every minute of it.

Again, I thank the community for the support you are showing our ambulance service.
